A party is liable for damages proximately caused by misrepresentation. To prove fraud,	[his] [her] fraudulent (party claiming fraud) must
prove:	
First, a representation of fact was made which was n	not true;
Second, either the falsity of the representation was k	nown to the party making it
or the representation was recklessly made;	
Third, the representation was made with the intent to	deceive and to induce
(party claiming fraud) to rely on the	representation; and
Fourth, (party claiming fraud)	did in fact rely on the
representation.	•
Each of these elements must be proved by clear and	d convincing evidence.
USE NOTES	

This instruction is to be used only in cases where the claim is for fraudulent misrepresentation. See UJI 13-1632 for cases where negligent misrepresentation claims are made.
