

Laws 2009 (1st SS) CHAPTER 1

AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE EXPENDITURES; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FROM LEGISLATIVE CASH BALANCES FOR NECESSARY EXPENSES OF THE FIRST SPECIAL SESSION OF THE FORTY-NINTH LEGISLATURE; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Chapter 1 Section 1 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 1. SPECIAL SESSION--APPROPRIATION.--

A. The following amounts are appropriated from the legislative cash balances for expenditure in fiscal year 2010 for the following expenses of the first special session of the forty-ninth legislature:

(1) for the expense of the house of representatives, one hundred ninety-five thousand six hundred fifty dollars (\$195,650) to be disbursed on vouchers signed by the speaker and the chief clerk of the house of representatives or the chief clerk's designee;

(2) for the expense of the senate, one hundred thirty-three thousand nine hundred dollars (\$133,900) to be disbursed on vouchers signed by the chair of the committees' committee and the chief clerk of the senate or the chief clerk's designee; and

(3) for the expense of the legislative council service, the joint bill room and the legislative switchboard, forty thousand four hundred dollars (\$40,400) to be disbursed on vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee.

B. Following adjournment of the first special session of the forty-ninth legislature, expenditures authorized in this section shall be disbursed on vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

Laws 2009 (1st SS) CHAPTER 2

AN ACT

TRANSFERRING MONEY TO THE GENERAL FUND; VOIDING CERTAIN FISCAL YEAR 2008 APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Chapter 2 Section 1 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 1. FUND TRANSFERS .--

A. Notwithstanding statutory restrictions on the use of money in the following funds, the following amounts are transferred to the general fund:

(1) one million dollars (\$1,000,000) is transferred from legislative cash balances:

(2) one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is transferred from the magistrate court mediation fund;

(3) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is transferred from the allocations to the administrative office of the courts from the water project fund;

(4) one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) is transferred from the metropolitan court warrant enforcement fund;

(5) one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is transferred from the metropolitan court mediation fund;

(6) one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) is transferred from the alternative dispute resolution fund of the third judicial district;

[(7) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is transferred from the audit fund;] *LINE-ITEM VETO*

(8) one million one hundred thousand dollars (\$1,100,000) is transferred from the property valuation fund; (9) one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) is transferred from the electronic voting system revolving fund; [(10) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is transferred from the domestic violence offender treatment or intervention fund;

(11) three million dollars (\$3,000,000) is transferred from the enhanced 911 fund;]LINE-ITEM VETO

(12) four hundred twelve thousand dollars (\$412,000) is transferred from the public election fund;

(13) twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) is transferred from the state employees' career development conference fund;

(14) one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is transferred from the securities education and training fund;

(15) one hundred seventy-two thousand dollars (\$172,000) is transferred from the real estate recovery fund;

(16) one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is transferred from the barbers and cosmetologists fund;

(17) three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) is transferred from the massage therapy fund;

(18) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is transferred from the counseling and therapy practice board fund;

(19) two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) is transferred from the chiropractic fund;

(20) two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) is transferred from the psychology fund;

(21) two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) is transferred from the physical therapy fund;

(22) two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) is transferred from the private investigations fund;

(23) four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) is transferred from the public accountancy fund;

(24) one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) is transferred from the real estate commission fund;

(25) six hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$650,000) is transferred from the board of social work examiners fund;

(26) one million dollars (\$1,000,000) is transferred from the New Mexico medical board fund;

(27) seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) is transferred from the board of nursing fund;

(28) six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) is transferred from the office of cultural affairs fund;

[(29) eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000) is transferred from the trail safety fund;]*LINE-ITEM VETO*

(30) one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) is transferred from the mining act fund;

(31) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is transferred from the oil and gas reclamation fund;

(32) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is transferred from the employment security department fund;

(33) three million five hundred thousand dollars (\$3,500,000) is transferred from the workers' compensation administration fund;

(34) one million dollars (\$1,000,000) is transferred from the uninsured employers' fund;

(35) two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) is transferred from the hazardous waste emergency fund;

(36) one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) is transferred from the natural resources trustee fund;

[(37) two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) is transferred from the children, youth and families pre-kindergarten fund;]LINE-ITEM VETO

(38) two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) is transferred from the juvenile continuum grant fund;

(39) one million one hundred seventy-six thousand dollars (\$1,176,000) is transferred from the juvenile community corrections grant fund;

(40) one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) is transferred from the community corrections grant fund;

(41) one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) is transferred from the corrections department intensive supervision fund;

(42) one million dollars (\$1,000,000) is transferred from the crime laboratory fund;

(43) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is transferred from the concealed handgun carry fund;

(44) nine hundred seventy-three thousand dollars (\$973,000) is transferred from the educational technology deficiency correction fund;

(45) one million nine hundred thousand dollars (\$1,900,000) is transferred from the instructional material fund;

(46) one million four hundred fifty thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,450,200) is transferred from the public pre- kindergarten fund;]LINE-ITEM VETO

(47) sixty-eight million dollars (\$68,000,000) is transferred from the college affordability endowment fund;

(48) two million eight hundred forty-eight thousand seven hundred dollars (\$2,848,700) is transferred from the higher education performance fund;

(49) three hundred fourteen thousand one hundred dollars (\$314,100) is transferred from the higher education endowment fund; and

(50) one hundred seventy-one thousand three hundred thirty-seven dollars (\$171,337) is transferred from the higher education program development enhancement fund.

B. One million two hundred thousand dollars (\$1,200,000) is transferred to the general fund from revenue generated from antitrust cases and consumer protection settlements through the attorney general on behalf of the state, political subdivisions or private citizens.

C. One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is transferred to the general fund from cash balances of the energy, minerals and natural resources department's mine reclamation program relating to hard rock and coal mining.

D. Notwithstanding the provisions of Paragraph (10) of Subsection A of Section 66-6-23 NMSA 1978, one million seven hundred thousand dollars (\$1,700,000)

collected pursuant to Subsection D of Section 66-5-44 NMSA 1978 is transferred to the general fund.

E. Five million dollars (\$5,000,000) is transferred to the general fund from the cash balances of the higher education department's special programs fund, related to student financial aid programs.

Chapter 2 Section 2 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 2. FISCAL YEAR 2008 UNSPENT APPROPRIATIONS--APPROPRIATION VOID.--The following appropriations in Section 7 of Chapter 3 of Laws 2008 are void:

A. six hundred sixty-seven thousand dollars (\$667,000) to the taxation and revenue department to begin replacement of the oil and natural gas accounting and reporting database with commercial off- the-shelf solutions; and

B. five hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$550,000) to the department of health for continued implementation of electronic medical records and health information exchange.

Chapter 2 Section 3 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 3. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

Laws 2009 (1st SS) CHAPTER 3

AN ACT

RELATING TO RESERVES; PROVIDING TRANSFER AUTHORITY FROM THE TAX STABILIZATION RESERVE AND THE OPERATING RESERVE TO THE GENERAL FUND TO ADDRESS THE FISCAL YEARS 2009 AND 2010 SHORTFALLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Chapter 3 Section 1 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 1. TRANSFER AUTHORITY--OPERATING RESERVE.--Two hundred twenty-five million dollars (\$225,000,000) is transferred from the operating reserve to the appropriation account of the general fund to meet fiscal year 2009 obligations.

Chapter 3 Section 2 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 2. TRANSFER AUTHORITY--TAX STABILIZATION RESERVE.--

A. The governor has projected the general fund revenues insufficient to meet the level of appropriations authorized by law from the general fund for the 2010 fiscal year's budget pursuant to Subsection D of Section 6-4-2.2 NMSA 1978.

B. If the revenue and other transfers to the general fund at the end of fiscal year 2010 are not sufficient to meet appropriations, the governor, with state board of finance approval, may transfer to the appropriation account of the general fund the amount necessary to meet the 2010 fiscal year's obligations from the tax stabilization reserve in a total not to exceed one hundred fifteen million dollars (\$115,000,000).

Laws 2009 (1st SS) CHAPTER 4

AN ACT

REDUCING LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATIONS IN LAWS 2009; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Chapter 4 Section 1 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 1. LEGISLATIVE BRANCH APPROPRIATION REDUCTIONS.--The appropriations made from the general fund in Laws 2009, Chapter 1, Sections 3 through 9, which were reduced by Section 13 of that chapter and were further reduced by Subsection B of Section 10 of the General Appropriation Act of 2009, are further reduced by five and three- tenths percent rounded to the nearest one hundred dollars (\$100). To meet the reductions required by this section and maintain government efficiency, the New Mexico legislative council shall determine the amount of reduction applied to each legislative agency and purpose and may transfer amounts from any of the appropriations in Laws 2009, Chapter 1 to any other legislative expenditure where they may be needed.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

Laws 2009 (1st SS) CHAPTER 5

AN ACT

RELATING TO GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS; REDUCING FISCAL YEAR 2010 APPROPRIATIONS; PROVIDING AUTHORITY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION TO ADJUST BUDGETS AND ALLOTMENTS TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT; REQUIRING CREATION OF A LIST OF VOIDABLE CAPITAL OUTLAY; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Chapter 5 Section 1 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 1. A new section of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 is enacted to read:

"FINDING.--Due to discrepancies between anticipated revenues and appropriations for fiscal year 2010, the legislature finds that New Mexico must reduce expenditures in fiscal year 2010."

Chapter 5 Section 2 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 2. A new section of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 is enacted to read:

"APPROPRIATION REDUCTIONS.--

A. The general fund appropriations in Section 4 of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 are reduced as follows:

(1) in Subsection A of that section, legislative building services is reduced by four percent;

(2) in Subsection B of that section, judicial agencies, district courts, the Bernalillo county metropolitan court, the district attorneys and the administrative office of the district attorneys are each reduced by two percent;

(3) state agencies under the control of all elected executive officials other than the governor are each reduced by four percent, except that the attorney general is reduced by two percent;

[(4) state agencies under the control of the governor are reduced by an aggregate of seven and six-tenths percent, except that:

(a) the public defender department is reduced by two

percent;

(b) the other financing uses category in the developmental disabilities support program of the department of health is reduced by two million dollars (\$2,000,000), which will be offset by two million dollars (\$2,000,000) from federal funds in the human services department;

(c) the law enforcement program of the department of public safety is reduced by not more than two percent;

(d) the other category in the medical assistance program of the human services department is reduced by sixteen million dollars (\$16,000,000), which will be offset by twelve million dollars (\$12,000,000) from federal funds;]LINE-ITEM VETO

(5) each public post-secondary educational institution is reduced by four percent in the instruction and general purposes category and six and five-tenths percent in every other category, including research and public service projects, with the institution determining reductions in each item of the category and between categories;

(6) the New Mexico military institute is reduced by two percent in the instruction and general purposes category and six and five-tenths percent in every other category, including research and public service projects, with the school determining reductions in each item of the category and between categories; and

(7) public school support is reduced as follows:

(a) the state equalization guarantee distribution by two

percent;

(b) the transportation distribution, including operational, school-owned bus replacements and rental fees, is reduced by four percent; and

(c) the supplemental distribution, including out-of-state tuition and emergency supplemental; the instructional material fund; dual-credit instructional materials; the educational technology fund; the schools in need of improvement fund; public education department special appropriations; apprenticeship assistance; and regional education cooperatives by six and five-tenths percent.

[B. In reducing budgets pursuant to the appropriation reductions pursuant to Paragraph (4) of Subsection A of this section, the governor shall first reduce personal services and employee benefits for one hundred two exempt positions in state agencies under the control of the governor."] *LINE-ITEM VETO*

Chapter 5 Section 3 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 3. A new section of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 is enacted to read:

"ADDITIONAL REDUCTIONS FOR EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS AND PUBLIC SCHOOLS[--AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT APPROPRIATIONS]. LINE-ITEM VETO

A. In addition to the general fund reductions in Subparagraph (a) of Paragraph (7) of Subsection A of Section 2 of this 2009 special session act, the state equalization guarantee distribution shall be further reduced by forty-five million five hundred thousand dollars (\$45,500,000).

[B. For fiscal year 2010, of the ninety-three million two hundred thousand dollars (\$93,200,000) remaining from the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 allocation to the state through the education fund of the state fiscal stabilization fund, forty-five million five hundred thousand dollars (\$45,500,000) shall be distributed to school districts and charter schools through the state equalization guarantee distribution, and thirteen million four hundred thousand dollars (\$13,400,000) shall be distributed proportionally to public post-secondary educational institutions in the instruction and general purposes category.

C. Of the amount remaining from the public safety and other government services allocation from the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) is allocated to the appropriation account of the general fund for fiscal year 2010."] *LINE-ITEM VETO*

Chapter 5 Section 4 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

[Section 4. A new section of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 is enacted to read:

"APPROPRIATION REDUCTION--SECTION 5.--The appropriation in Section 5 of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 to the department of information technology for the New Mexico computing applications center is reduced by one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000)."] *LINE-ITEM VETO*

Chapter 5 Section 5 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 5. A new section of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 is enacted to read:

"TOBACCO SETTLEMENT PROGRAM FUND--APPROPRIATION TO MEDICAID.-- Four million dollars (\$4,000,000) is appropriated from the tobacco settlement program fund to the human services department for expenditure in fiscal year 2010 for the medical assistance program. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2010 shall revert to the tobacco settlement program fund."

Chapter 5 Section 6 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 6. A new section of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 is enacted to read:

"PUBLIC SCHOOLS--EMERGENCY SUPPLEMENTAL.--Three million dollars (\$3,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the emergency supplemental distribution of the public school fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2010 by the public education department to make emergency distributions to [small rural]school districts [with a total membership of fewer than six hundred in their elementary, middle and high schools] in financial need, but no money shall be distributed to any school district having cash and invested reserves, or other resources or any combination thereof, equaling five percent or more of the school district's operational budget. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2010 shall revert to the general fund." *LINE-ITEM VETO*

Chapter 5 Section 7 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 7. A new section of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 is enacted to read:

"APPROPRIATION--PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL OUTLAY FUND FOR INSURANCE COVERAGE.--Notwithstanding the provisions of the Public School Capital Outlay Act, twenty-nine million dollars (\$29,000,000) is appropriated from the public school capital outlay fund to the public school insurance authority for expenditure in fiscal year 2010 for the purpose of reimbursing or paying property insurance premiums on behalf of school districts and charter schools. Of the appropriation, the amount necessary to reimburse or pay up to seven million dollars (\$7,000,000) for property insurance coverage in fiscal year 2010 for the Albuquerque public school district shall be distributed by the public school insurance authority to the Albuquerque public school district. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2010 shall revert to the public school capital outlay fund."

Chapter 5 Section 8 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 8. A new section of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 is enacted to read:

"WORKFORCE SOLUTIONS DEPARTMENT APPROPRIATION.--Two million dollars (\$2,000,000) is appropriated from the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 unemployment insurance modernization funding to the workforce solutions department for operating expenditures in fiscal year 2010."

Chapter 5 Section 9 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 9. A new section of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 is enacted to read:

"OPERATING BUDGETS AND ALLOTMENTS REDUCED TO COMPLY--OTHER REDUCTIONS TO CONFORM--OVER-ALLOTMENTS--DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.--

A. The department of finance and administration shall reduce fiscal year 2010 operating budgets and adjust allotments to comply with the provisions of this 2009 special session act and may reduce appropriations from other state funds, internal service/interagency transfers and federal funds as necessary to match the general fund reductions in the fiscal year 2010 operating budgets. The legislative finance committee shall review the adjusted operating budgets in a timely manner.

B. If, in this act or any other act of the first special session of the fortyninth legislature, a general fund appropriation or budget is reduced and funds in excess of the amount of the reduced appropriation or budget have already been allotted to the state agency receiving the appropriation, the department of finance and administration may reduce any other general fund allotment to the state agency in order to recoup the over-allotment of the reduced appropriation or budget. In the case of an appropriation made to one state agency but disbursed or transferred to another state agency, the department of finance and administration may reduce any other general fund allotment to the agency to which the appropriation was disbursed or transferred in order to recoup the over-allotment of the reduced appropriation or budget. The authority provided in this section is additional to any other power the department of finance and administration has to remedy over-allotments, and the grant of authority in this section shall not be deemed to be a legislative determination that the department of finance and administration does not otherwise have the authority provided in this section. C. As used in this section, "state agency" means any department, institution, board, bureau, commission, district or committee of the government of the state and means every office or officer of any of the above."

Chapter 5 Section 10 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

[Section 10. TEMPORARY PROVISION--REPORTS.--The department of finance and administration, the higher education department for public post-secondary educational institutions and special schools and the public education department for public schools shall report the new operating budgets, including allotment adjustments, to the New Mexico legislative council, the legislative finance committee and the legislative education study committee on the implementation of this act for state government, public post-secondary educational institutions and public schools. Reports, including new operating budgets, shall be published on the departments' web sites.] *LINE-ITEM VETO*

Chapter 5 Section 11 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

[Section 11. TEMPORARY PROVISION--FISCAL YEAR 2011 BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS.--The recurring general fund reductions provided for in this act shall be carried forward in the fiscal year 2011 executive budget recommendations presented to the legislature as provided by Section 6-3-21 NMSA 1978.] *LINE-ITEM VETO*

Chapter 5 Section 12 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 12. TEMPORARY PROVISION--CAPITAL OUTLAY LIST OF VOIDABLE PROJECTS.--The legislative council service, the legislative finance committee and the department of finance and administration shall review all unexpended capital outlay projects funded by general fund appropriations and identify one hundred fifty million dollars (\$150,000,000) of voidable capital outlay projects by the effective date of this special session act. A minimum of one hundred fifty million dollars (\$150,000,000) in unexpended general fund capital outlay projects that have been determined by the legislative council service, the legislative finance committee and the department of finance and administration to be voidable shall be submitted as a bill for legislative consideration and action in the second session of the forty-ninth legislature.

AN ACT

RELATING TO FLEXIBILITY FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL OUTLAY FUND TO PAY FOR PROPERTY INSURANCE ON BEHALF OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND CHARTER SCHOOLS DURING FISCAL YEAR 2010; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Chapter 6 Section 1 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 1. APPROPRIATION--PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL OUTLAY FUND FOR INSURANCE COVERAGE.--Notwithstanding the provisions of the Public School Capital Outlay Act, twenty-nine million dollars (\$29,000,000) is appropriated from the public school capital outlay fund to the public school insurance authority for expenditure in fiscal year 2010 for the purpose of reimbursing or paying property insurance premiums on behalf of school districts and charter schools. Of the appropriation, the amount necessary to reimburse or pay up to seven million dollars (\$7,000,000), for property insurance coverage in fiscal year 2010 for the Albuquerque public school district, shall be distributed by the public school insurance authority to the Albuquerque public school district. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2010 shall revert to the public school capital outlay fund.

Chapter 6 Section 2 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

Laws 2009 (1st SS) CHAPTER 7

AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL OUTLAY; REVERTING BALANCES OF CERTAIN GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS; TRANSFERRING BALANCES TO THE GENERAL FUND; AUTHORIZING CERTAIN SEVERANCE TAX BOND APPROPRIATIONS; PROVIDING FOR REVERSION OF CERTAIN BALANCES; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. GENERAL FUND BALANCES REVERTED.--Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the unexpended balance up to the amount specified of the following appropriations shall not be expended and shall revert to the general fund pursuant to procedures, policies and deadlines established by the financial control division of the department of finance and administration:

Chapter 7 Section 2 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--AUTHORIZATIONS--APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts authorized for purposes specified in this act. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated for the purposes specified in this act.

B. The agencies named in this act shall certify to the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this act. If an agency has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds for a particular project, including projects that have been reauthorized, by the end of fiscal year 2011, the authorization for that project is void.

C. Before an agency may certify for the issuance of severance tax bonds, the project must be developed sufficiently so that the agency reasonably expects to:

(1) incur within six months after the applicable bonds have been issued a substantial binding obligation to a third party to expend at least five percent of the bond proceeds for the project; and

(2) spend at least eighty-five percent of the bond proceeds within three years after the applicable bonds have been issued.

D. Except as otherwise specifically provided by law:

(1) the unexpended balance from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to this act for a project shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund no later than the following dates:

(a) for a project for which severance tax bonds were issued to match federal grants, six months after completion of the project;

(b) for a project for which severance tax bonds were issued to purchase vehicles, including emergency vehicles and other vehicles that require special equipment; heavy equipment; books; educational technology; or other equipment or furniture that is not related to a more inclusive construction or renovation project, at the end of the fiscal year two years following the fiscal year in which the severance tax bonds were issued for the purchase; and

(c) for any other project for which severance tax bonds were issued, within six months of completion of the project, but no later than the end of fiscal year 2013; and

(2) all remaining balances from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued for a project pursuant to this act shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund three months after the latest reversion date specified for that type of project in Paragraph (1) of this subsection.

E. Except for appropriations to the capital program fund, money from severance tax bond proceeds provided pursuant to this act shall not be used to pay indirect project costs.

F. For the purpose of this section, "unexpended balance" means the remainder of an appropriation after reserving for unpaid costs and expenses covered by binding written obligations to third parties.

Chapter 7 Section 4 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 4. PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL OUTLAY FUND--TRANSFERS TO GENERAL FUND.--

A. Thirty-one million six hundred thousand dollars (\$31,600,000) is transferred from the public school capital outlay fund to the general fund for the purpose of meeting appropriations from the general fund. The money transferred represents the remaining portion of the amount of the general fund appropriation made in Laws 2006, Chapter 111, Section 66 that has been allocated to school districts for the state share of projects pursuant to Section 22-24- 5.7 NMSA 1978 but that has not yet been expended.

B. Twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) is transferred from the public school capital outlay fund to the general fund for the purpose of meeting appropriations from the general fund. The money transferred represents the amount transferred from the general fund to the public school capital outlay fund in Subsection C of Section 12 of the General Appropriation Act of 2009.

Chapter 7 Section 5 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 5. SEVERANCE TAX BOND APPROPRIATIONS TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL OUTLAY FUND.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 2 of this act, upon certification by the public school capital outlay council that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the public school capital outlay fund for the following purposes, and any unexpended or unencumbered balance shall not revert:

A. thirty-one million six hundred thousand dollars (\$31,600,000) for the purpose of meeting allocations made in Laws 2006, Chapter 111, Section 66 to school districts for the state share of the projects pursuant to Section 22-24-5.7 NMSA 1978; and

B. twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) to carry out the purposes of the Public School Capital Outlay Act.

Chapter 7 Section 6 Laws 2009 (1st S.S.)

Section 6. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
